

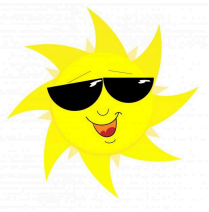
Summer Choice Boards – 4th Grade



Directions: For each week, choose two activities to complete.

MATH

A movie started at 6:45 PM. It lasted 1 hour and 35 minutes. At what time did the movie end?	178 people are going on a field trip. A bus holds 20 people. How many buses are needed? Show your thinking in your notebook.	What time is it now? Write down the time. What time will it be in 85 minutes?	Measure the perimeter of two different sized windows in your home. Find the difference in the perimeters.	You went shopping with a \$5 bill and spent \$2.40. Is your change more or less than 40 dimes? Prove your answer.
Measure your height in inches. Measure another family member. What is the difference in height?	Figure your age in months. Challenge: Figure your age in weeks.	Sophia runs twice as fast as her friend Julie. If Julie runs 3 mph (miles per hour), how long will it take Sophia to run 6 miles? 9 miles?	If you played outside today for 3 ½ hours, how many minutes would that be?	Go to a local library three times this week. Create a graph showing how many people are there on each day.
A farmer has chickens and cows. What combination of animals could total 24 legs? Is there more than one combination?	Write a word problem whose answer is 74. Have someone solve the problem. Choose another answer and make up a problem.	Write this number in standard form: 13 hundreds, 16 tens, 22 ones	Draw two shapes. Color $\frac{2}{3}$ of each shape red.	Roll two dice. Multiply the numbers rolled and write the matching equation. Do this 10 times.
Go on a walk around your neighborhood. Count how many steps you take.	Flip a coin 50 times. Make a graph of how many times it was heads and how many times it was tails.	Play outside for 2,700 seconds. How many minutes did you play?	Go on a walk to a nearby park and count how many steps you take on the way there and how many you take on the way back. What is the difference?	Watch a movie with your family. Count how many times the characters say the word "Yes".

Find 5 unknown or interesting words in a book and define them.	Choose two characters from a book and compare or contrast them.	Write 3-5 things you learned from your book.	Illustrate a new cover for your book.	Determine what text features your book has (table of contents, index, etc)
Write a paragraph describing the theme of the book.	Illustrate a character from your book.	Find an object in your home that is special to you and write a paragraph explaining why it is special.	Write a sequel to your favorite book using the main characters.	Write a review of a book. Explain why you did or did not like it.
What is the main problem or event in the story? How do you know?	Visit your local library and pick out a book from a genre you have not read yet this summer!	Read a book and then watch the movie based on it. Write a paragraph comparing and contrasting them.	Write a paragraph explaining what you think the characters will do after the end of your story.	Write an autobiography - a story about your own life.
Interview a special person in your life and write a biography about their life.	Read to another person for 20 minutes.	Write a fiction story about what you did this summer. Remember, fiction means not true!	Create a timeline of events that happened in your story. Include 3-5 sentences about every event.	Make a list of all the books you read this summer. Rank them from best to worst.
